Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Title 25, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW CHAPTER</u>, to be known and designated as Chapter 41, Title 25, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

17 CHAPTER 41

RURAL VETERINARIANS LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM

25-4101. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Applicant" means an individual requesting a grant from the rural veterinarians loan repayment program.
- (2) "Application period" means the time period from October 1 to November 30 of the state fiscal year for which funding is requested.
- (3) "Approval" means written notification that the application will be awarded funding through the rural veterinarians loan repayment program.
- (4) "Board" means the rural veterinarians loan repayment grant review board.
 - (5) "Department" means the state department of agriculture.
 - (6) "Director" means the director of the department.
- (7) "Grant period" means the time immediately following the application period from December 1 through June 30 for which funding is granted.
- (8) "Qualified veterinary education debt" means a debt with a financial aid program or financial institution incurred to meet the educational costs of attending an accredited veterinary school.
 - (9) "Rural veterinarian" means an individual who:
 - (a) Is licensed to practice veterinary medicine pursuant to chapter 21, title 54, Idaho Code; and
 - (b) Dedicates no less than fifty percent (50%) of the individual's practice to providing veterinary care to food and production animals in a rural area, as determined by the department.

- (10) "Rural veterinarians loan repayment grant" or "grant" means a grant awarded pursuant to this chapter.
- (11) "Rural veterinarians loan repayment program" or "program" means the rural veterinarians loan repayment program established by this chapter.
- (12) "Rural veterinarians loan repayment fund" or "fund" means the fund in the state treasury established in section 25-4102, Idaho Code.
- 25-4102. RURAL VETERINARIANS LOAN REPAYMENT FUND. There is hereby established in the state treasury a rural veterinarians loan repayment fund to be administered by the department. Moneys in the fund shall:
 - (1) Be continuously appropriated to pay for:
 - (a) The qualified veterinary education debt of rural veterinarians; and
 - (b) The expenses of administering the rural veterinarians loan repayment program, which expenses shall not exceed ten percent (10%) of the annual appropriation by the legislature; and
 - (2) Consist of:

- (a) Legislative appropriations;
- (b) Eligible federal funds, if any;
- (c) Donations; and
- (d) Interest earned on idle moneys in the fund.
- 25-4103. REVIEW BOARD. (1) The director shall appoint seven (7) members of a board to be known as the rural veterinarians loan repayment grant review board. Members of the board:
 - (a) Shall consist of the Idaho state veterinarian, production agriculture representatives, and veterinarians;
 - (b) Shall serve at the pleasure of the director; and
 - (c) Shall not be compensated but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred for attendance at board meetings.
- (2) The board shall meet at least annually for the purposes described in this chapter.
- (3) Appointments to the board shall be for three (3) years, except for initial appointments to the board, which shall be staggered such that two (2) board members are appointed for one (1) year, two (2) board members are appointed for two (2) years, and three (3) board members are appointed for three (3) years. Board members may be reappointed at the end of their terms.
- (4) A majority of the board members constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. A majority vote is required by the quorum in finalizing decisions.
- 25-4104. RURAL VETERINARIANS LOAN REPAYMENT GRANT AWARDS. (1) The board may award grants in accordance with the procedures and criteria in this chapter to rural veterinarians for qualified veterinary education debt repayments.
- (2) Subject to available funding, rural veterinarian loan repayment grant awards shall be made to applicants who:
 - (a) Are rural veterinarians;
 - (b) Are not receiving another loan repayment award at the time of application; and

- (c) Meet other eligibility criteria as determined by the department.
- (3) A rural veterinarian selected to receive a rural veterinarians loan repayment grant award shall be entitled to receive qualified veterinary education debt repayments for a period not to exceed three (3) years in such amount as is determined annually.
- (4) Award amounts shall be determined annually by the department based on recommendations from the board. Factors in the determination shall include:
 - (a) Availability of funding; and

- (b) The number of new applicants.
- (5) The award shall not exceed the qualified veterinary education debt incurred by the recipient, and the maximum amount of educational debt repayments that a rural veterinarian may receive shall be twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) in one (1) year and seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) over a three (3) year period.
- (6) All grant awards shall be paid directly from the rural veterinarians loan repayment fund to the rural veterinarian receiving the award.
- (7) In determining the awards to be made in any given year, the board and the department shall consider the value of retaining an appropriate balance in the fund for use in future years.
- (8) An award payment to a recipient in a single year is not guaranteed or assured in subsequent years and may be increased or reduced. Award payments shall not continue to be made to a recipient who accepts another loan repayment award.
- (9) Any unused grant funds shall be returned to the rural veterinarians loan repayment fund by the recipient no later than February 28 of the grant period.
- (10) Grant awards are limited to qualified veterinary education debt repayments for rural veterinarians.
- 25-4105. RURAL VETERINARIANS LOAN REPAYMENT GRANT APPLICATIONS REQUIRED. (1) A completed grant application must be submitted by the applicant to the board for the purpose of requesting a grant on or before the conclusion of the application period specified for the appropriate grant cycle. All applications must include the required information.
- (2) The grant application and any attachments submitted by the applicant shall be the primary source of information for awarding a grant. Additionally, the board may request or use other information known to it in making its decision.
 - (3) All grant applications shall be on a form prescribed by the board.
- 25-4106 . RURAL VETERINARIANS LOAN REPAYMENT GRANT AWARD SCHEDULE -- ACTIVITY REPORT. (1) The board shall conduct the grant process in accordance with the schedule provided in this section.
- (2) The director or the director's designee shall develop an application form and make guidance, including any eligibility criteria, available no later than October 1, which shall initiate the application period prior to the grant period.
- (3) The completed application shall be submitted no later than November 30 of the application period.

(4) The board shall notify applicants of the disposition of their grant request by February 15 prior to the grant period.

- (5) Funds for approved rural veterinarians loan repayment grants shall be disbursed according to a schedule adopted by the department.
- (6) Grant recipients shall submit activity reports on a form and schedule adopted by the department.
- 25-4107. FRAUDULENT INFORMATION ON GRANT APPLICATION. Providing false information on any application or document submitted under this chapter is a misdemeanor and grounds for declaring the applicant ineligible. Any and all funds determined to have been acquired on the basis of fraudulent information must be returned to the rural veterinarians loan repayment grant program. This section shall not limit other remedies that may be available for the filing of false or fraudulent applications.
- 25-4108. DEPARTMENT AUTHORITY. The department is authorized to take all actions necessary to implement and enforce the provisions of this chapter, including the promulgation of any necessary rules.
 - 25-4109. ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS. Applicants aggrieved by the award or failure to award a grant pursuant to this chapter shall be afforded the remedies provided in chapter 52, title 67, Idaho Code.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2022.
